She works closely with the Chronic Conditions and other health programs in the NT Department of Health and works collaboratively with AMSANT, IAHA, Centre for Remote Health, Lowitja Institute of Indigenous Health Research, CRANAP*lus*, LIME and of course the NRHA. Finally, she is undertaking PhD studies where her thesis is on exploring preparation for health professionals to be culturally safe and effective practitioners in Indigenous primary health care settings.
