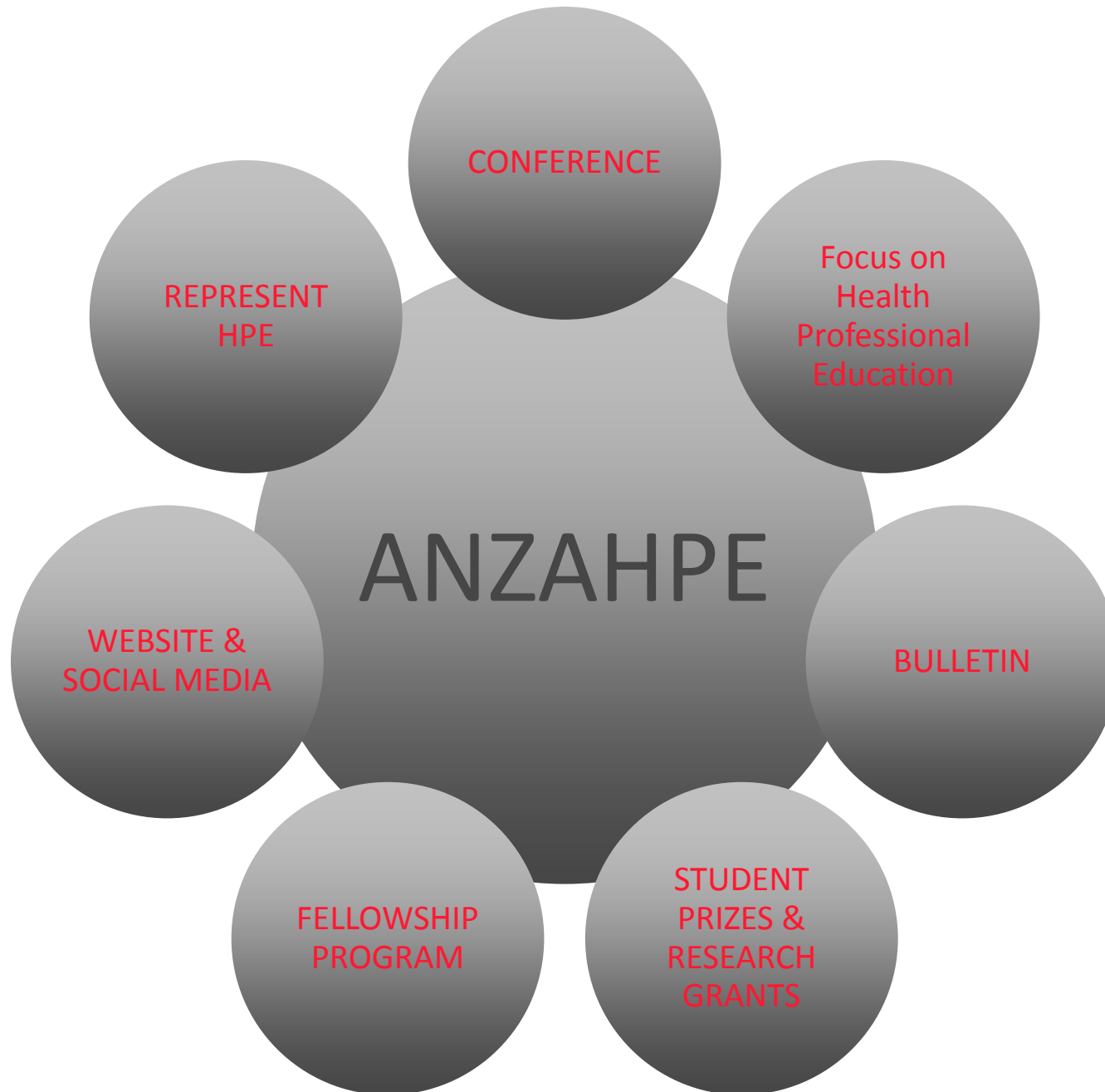

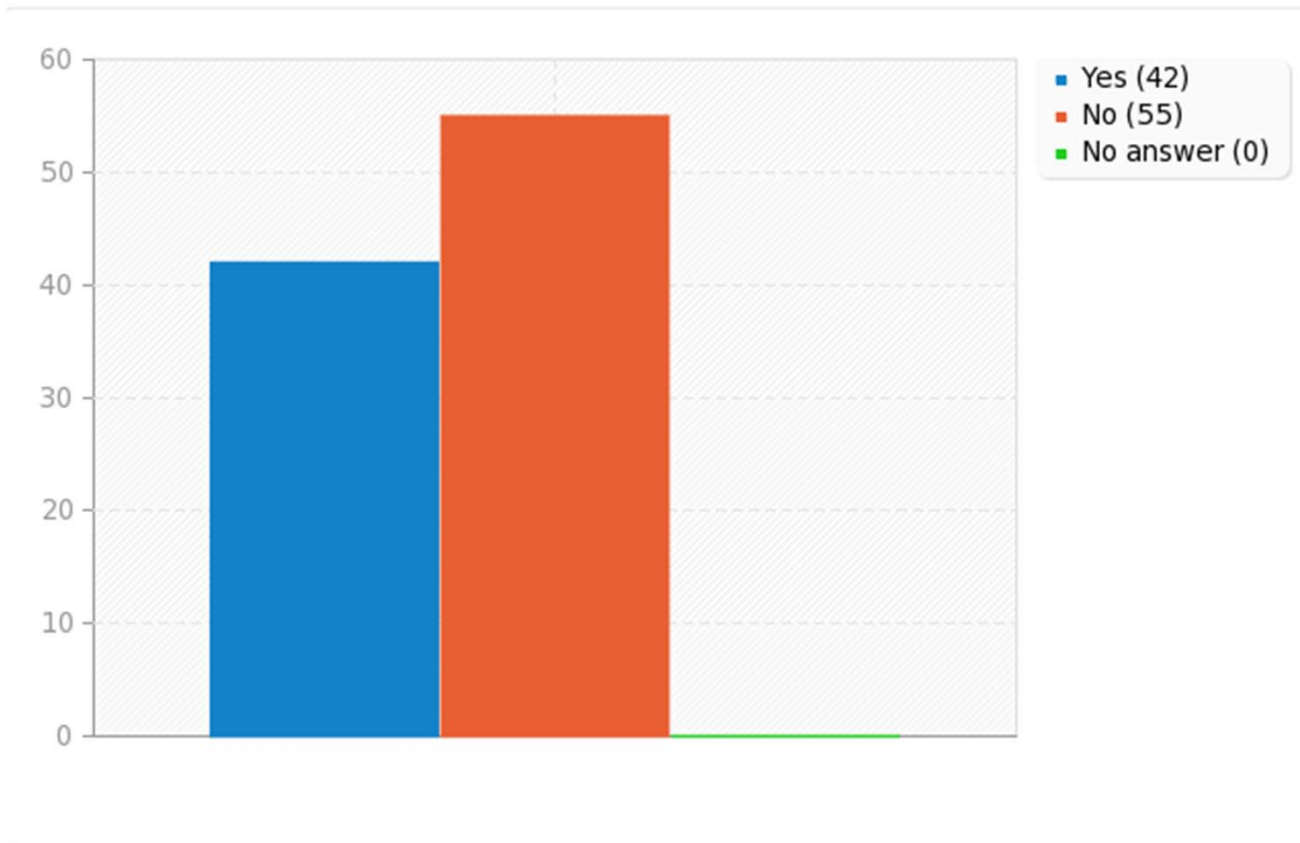

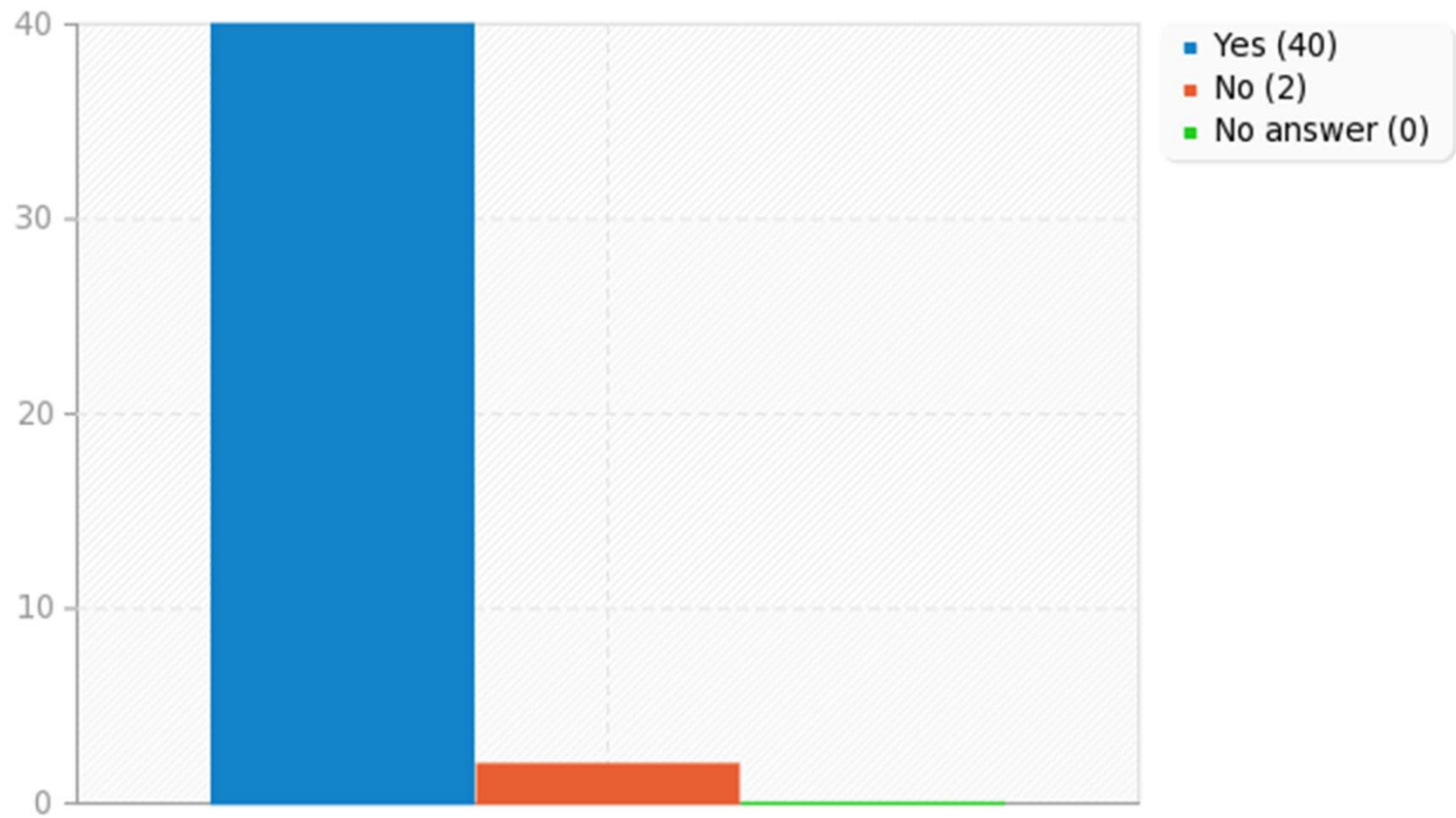
Current total member numbers



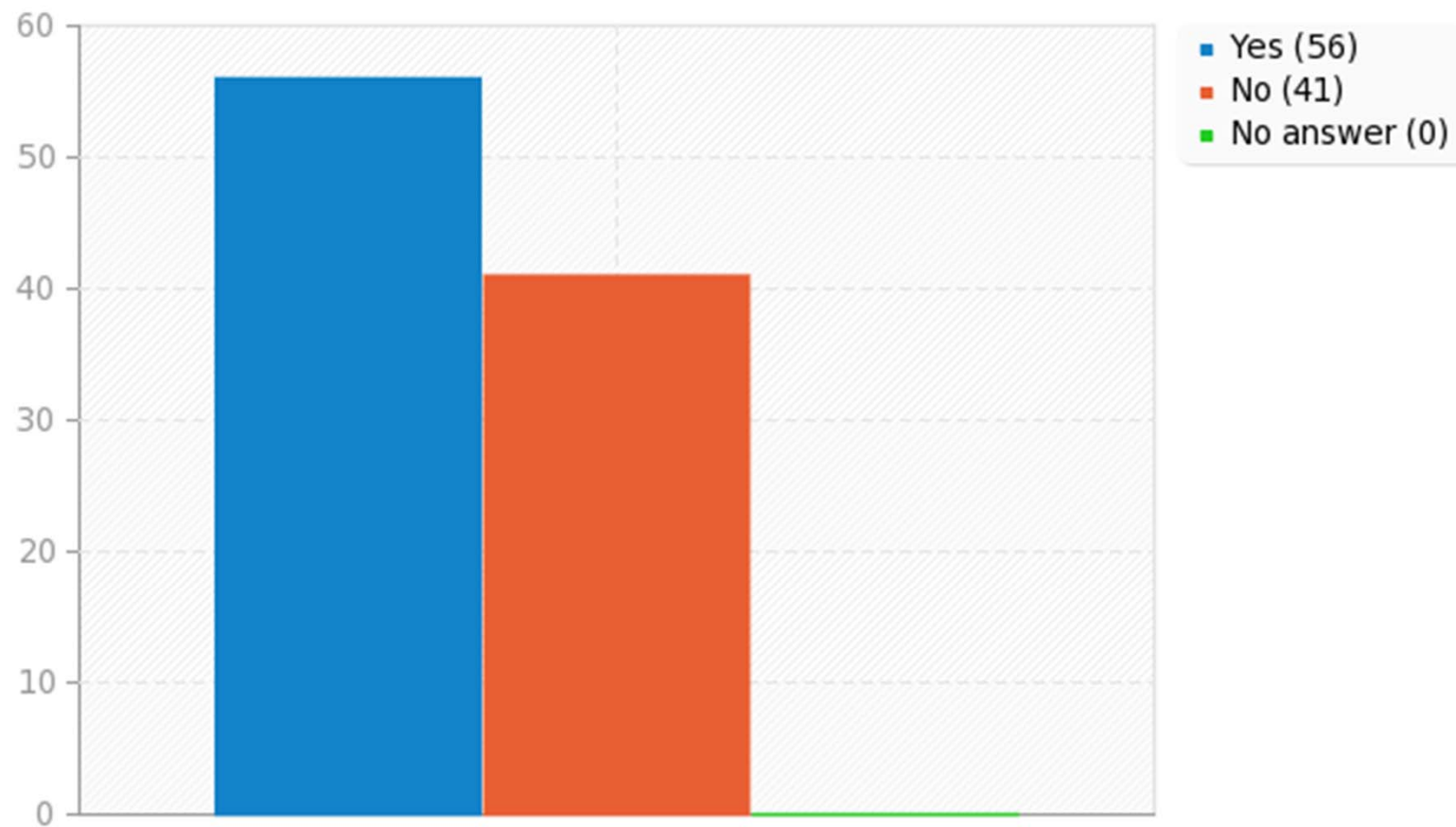
Are you currently involved in health professional education programs in a rural location?

ANZAHPE offers a wonderful ‘community of practice’ for rural clinicians and academics who are interested in education.

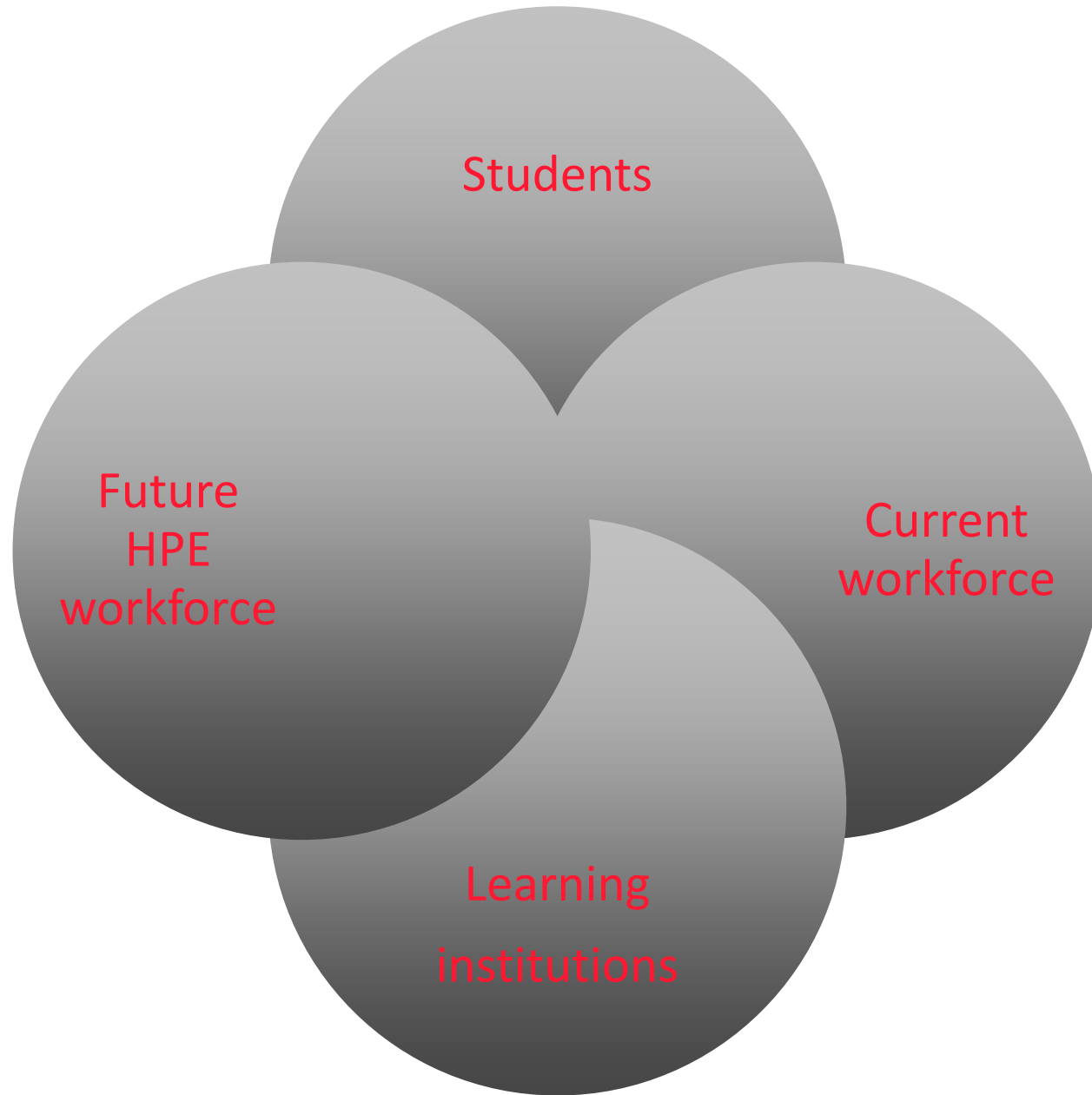
