

Megan Davis

Professor Megan Davis is a Professor of Law and Director of the Indigenous Law Centre, UNSW and a Commissioner of the NSW Land and Environment Court. Megan is also a UN Expert Member of the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues (UNPFII) (state member) and holds portfolios including Administration of Justice and Gender and Women. In 2012, Megan was the Rapporteur of the UNPFII Expert Group Meeting on violence against Indigenous women, held in New York; and was elected again in 2013 as



Rapporteur of the UNPFII Expert Group Meeting on Indigenous Youth. In 2015 Megan was the Rapporteur of the UNPFII Expert Group Meeting on an Optional Protocol on the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Megan teaches, writes and researches in the areas of Public Law (Constitutional Law) and Public International Law. In 2011, Megan was appointed by the Federal Government to the Expert Panel on the Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in the Constitution and continues to be involved in legal discussions on the constitutional issues relating to the referendum model. In addition, Megan specialises in legal issues pertaining to violence against Indigenous women.
