The local Darwin arts and cultural community will be heavily involved, which guarantees a good program of arts and health, dealing with both its educational and therapeutic aspects.

Bring your views to Darwin to help celebrate the positives about life in rural and remote Australia and to ensure that, as soon as possible, everyone in rural and remote areas has equivalent opportunities and health as people in our major cities.

This important event should be accessible to most people, thanks to core support from the Department of Health through its funding to the NRHA.
